

Citing Literature Reviews/Articles

from the

Print Reference Gale Literature Criticism Series

(including: Short Story Criticism, Twentieth Century Literary Criticism, Nineteenth Century Literature Criticism, Poetry Criticism, Drama Criticism, Literature Criticism 1400-1800)

Literature criticism included in the Gale Lit-Crit series noted above are critical reviews previously published in other publications and reprinted for reference in the Gale Lit-Crit “encyclopedias”. When you use one of these critical reviews as a source for research, you will need to build an MLA Citation for the review to include in your Works Cited list.

Citations for Gale Lit-Crit must include:

- information for the **original publication** of the review
- information about the **review’s reprint in the Gale Lit-Crit** volumes

STEPS TO BUILD THE CITATION:

1. Find the original publication information/citation printed at the beginning or end of the review article (for help finding the original citation see tips at the bottom of this handout)
2. Your Works Cited entry begins with the original citation exactly as it appears with the review
3. Next add:
 - a. Rpt. in
 - b. then type the title of the Gale Lit-Crit encyclopedia the review came from (for example: Short Story Criticism)
4. Next add:
 - a. Ed.
 - b. then type the editor(s) of the Gale Lit-Crit encyclopedia (found on the title page of the Lit-Crit volume)
5. Next add:
 - a. Vol.
 - b. then type the volume number of the Gale Lit-Crit encyclopedia you found the review in (look at the title page or spine of the book)
6. Next add the publisher information (publisher information is the same for all Gale Lit-Crit sets)
 - a. type: Detroit: Gale,
 - b. type the year that volume was published (found on the back of the title page of the Lit-Crit volume)
7. Finally, add the exact page numbers of the Gale Lit-Crit encyclopedia where you found the review reprinted.

ORIGINAL CITATION:

Holladay, Hillary. “Narrative Space in Ann Petry’s Country Place.” Xavier Review 16 (1996): 21-35.

REPRINT CITATION:

Rpt. in Twentieth-Century Literary Criticism. Ed. Linda Pavlovski and Scott Darga. Vol. 112. Detroit: Gale, 2002. 356-62.

TO FIND the ORIGINAL CITATION:

- information is printed with the article in the Gale Lit-Crit encyclopedia
- some sets print the original citation at the beginning of the review and others print it right at the end of the review
- at the beginning of the article, where it reads (SOURCE: that is your original citation
- in some volumes it will not say SOURCE but you’ll find the original publication information at the end of the article – it begins with the author’s name and then the title of the review article
