HOW DOES COLLEGE NOW WORK?

College Now students are released from their high school to attend Lincoln Land Community College-Taylorville during the afternoons. Typically, classes are held Monday through Friday from 1 to 3 p.m. Some courses may start a bit earlier and some end a bit later; please refer to your class schedule for exact days and times. Students earn both college credit and high school credit. Interested students should talk with their high school counselor about the College Now program.
