2. Approval of Budget Increase for Capital Renewal Project for Renovate and Expand Student Services

The CDB needs the Board to approve an increase to the budget based on the lowest bid received to allow the bid review and contractor award process to move forward. The lowest bid received is \$284,925 over the available budget. The CDB has not (to date) been able to provide additional funds to the project, therefore, the College will need to increase the amount of our contribution. This increase brings the total project budget to \$6,609,925 and the College's total contribution to \$2,816,925. The \$284,925 budget increase will be funded with Restricted Funds.

B. President's Report

Dr. Warren reported that enrollment was up 5.19% and discussed enrollment in various disciplines.

Applications are being accepted for free health care training through the PATH (Pipeline for the Advancement of the Healthcare Workforce) program. PATH, funded through an Illinois Community College Board grant, seeks to address the worker shortage in health care by removing financial and other barriers for eligible students. Free tuition, fees and books; a monthly stipend; rental, childcare, transportation and other assistance are provided. In addition to three levels of nursing, PATH covers training in 14 other health care fields.

LLCC will receive nearly \$60,000 in funds from the U.S. Department of Education to support the creation of an open educational resource (OER) textbook and materials. A team of LL@C

staff will work toward creating the OER which will be available to students free of charge. Leslie Ross, professor/librarian, was selected to join the Certificate in Open Education Resources Librarianship program offered through the Open Education Network and the University of Minnesota. She will use this experience to help promote OER in the LLCC community and assist faculty with OER adoption.

LLCC Innovation in Diversity and Inclusion (IDI) Grants have been awarded for projects including: The Occupational Therapy Assistant program will create a community-based, service-learning program for at-risk youth; The Diagnostic Medical Sonography program will work to attract participation of a minority echocardiographer to develop curriculum for a new cardiovascular AAS degree program with the goal of increasing the diversity of the health professions faculty; and the Hip Hop and Higher Education project seeks to address retention of African-American students by creating a sense of cultural and academic inclusion.

Leslie Catalano, Assistant Professor of Nursing and Bridgette Hudson, Nursing Instructor have been awarded \$10,000 Nursing Educator Fellowship Grants from the Illinois Board of Higher Education. The awards will assist as they both pursue Doctor of Nursing Practice (DNP) degrees. They were among 40 nurse educators across the state receiving the awards designed to "help retain well-qualified nursing faculty at institutions of higher education."

Bistro-To-Go reopened yesterday and will operate Tuesdays through Thursdays 11 a.m.-1 p.m. through Feb. 23. The Bistro will open again March 21 with sit-down service.

LLCC Jacksonville and Taylorville hosted informational sessions on the College Now program, and Jacksonville has an event this evening promoting scholarships and FAFSA completion. An information session for volunteer adult education tutors was also held in Taylorville.

The free chamber music recital began at 5 p.m. today in A. Lincoln Commons. This is the first of three in a series of recitals this semester featuring music faculty and other artists.

Today is Homecoming at the college. Activities have been going on since Monday, and this evening's basketball games will feature the crowing of homecoming royalty and recognition of the late Dick Dhabalt, the college's first athletic director.

RESOLUTION ABATING THE 2022 TAX LEVY FOR THE LINCOLN LAND COMMUNITY COLLEGE (COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT NO. 526) GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS (ALTERNATE REVENUE SOURCE), SERIES 2019

WHEREAS, Lincoln Land Community College (Community College District No. 526), Counties of Sangamon, Bond, Cass, Christian, DeWitt, Fayette, Green, Logan, Macon, Macoupin, Mason, Menard, Montgomery, Morgan and Scott, and State of Illinois (the "District") issued its \$7,500,000 General Obligation Bonds (Alternate Revenue Source), Series 2019 (the "Bonds") pursuant to a resolution adopted February 27, 2019 (the "Bond Resolution") by the Board of Trustees of the District (the "Board"); and

WHEREAS, the Bond Resolution has a 2022 tax levy collectable in 2023 to pay principal and interest coming due on the Bonds (the "Tax Levy"), and provides that the District may abate the Tax Levy if the District has funds in the amount of the Tax Levy irrevocably on deposit in the Bond Fund; and

WHEREAS, the Board finds that the Bond Fund does now contain funds irrevocably on deposit in the amount of the Tax Levy with which the District will pay principal and interest on the Bonds next coming due.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF LINCOLN LAND COMMUNITY COLLEGE (COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT NO. 526), SANGAMON COUNTY, ILLINOIS, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1</u>. <u>Incorporation of Preambles</u>. The Board finds that the recitals contained in the preambles to this Resolution are true and correct and does incorporate such recitals into this Resolution by this reference.

Section 2. Determination to Abate Tax Levy. The Board elects to abate the Tax Levy and authorizes and directs the Treasurer of the District to file all such documents and certificates with the County Clerks of the counties in which the District is located directing the County Clerks to abate the Tax Levy.
