B. President's Report

Our spring semester is underway! It began January 12th with staff and faculty welcoming students and Student Engagement holding a variety of Welcome Week activities, including back to school bingo, vision boarding, painting planters and more. Special welcome events were also held at our Outreach Centers.

Logger Launch was held on January 7th with 76 participants. It is a special welcome event for new students held before classes begin. It is designed to help them feel confident, comfortable, and prepared for their first day at LLCC. During the event, new students have the opportunity to meet LLCC staff, ask questions, explore campus, and connect with the resources they will need throughout the semester.

LLCC has earned the Certificate of Excellence in Financial Reporting from ASBO International. The certificate is awarded for excellence in financial reporting and transparency and recognizes the school business best practice of preparing a high quality Annual Comprehensive Financial Report.

The first week of January we officially launched the Professional Development Institute at LLCC — a new sub-brand of college offerings. It features the many continuing education opportunities we offer that are designed to meet the evolving needs of employers and working professionals — such as essential workplace skills, leadership and management development, digital and tech skills, entrepreneurship, artificial

intelligence, continuing education for teachers and health care workers, workforce training, as well as customizing training for businesses.

We were a silver sponsor of Frontiers International Springfield's Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Memorial Breakfast on Monday. This was the 51st annual memorial breakfast. The featured speaker was Erika Harold, Executive Director of the Illinois Supreme Court Commission on Professionalism. Thanks to those who represented LLCC, including Mark Holaway, at this community event.

LLCC's Education program and use of RISE technology was featured on the Community College Connections segment on WCIA's morning program earlier this month.

Our Academy of Lifelong Learning has partnered with financial experts, Fidelity, J.P. Morgan, and Capital Group, to offer a three-part speaker series on understanding cryptocurrency and the digital ecosystem. The virtual series is free and is being offered via Zoom. The first session was today on "Bitcoin and Digital Assets – Understanding the Digital Ecosystem." Upcoming sessions will be held January 28th on "Understanding Cryptocurrency" and February 4th on "Implications of Investing in Artificial Intelligence."

The grades are in and LLCC student athletes had an outstanding fall with a 3.41 cumulative GPA, which sets a new record for student-athlete fall GPAs.

The Trutter Museum & Murray Gallery is currently featuring the exhibit "The Neophobic Kingdom," which features artwork by sculptor Thad Duhigg. It will be available for viewing through February 12th, and there is a closing reception that day, 5:30-7:30 in the evening. Known for his mastery of bronze casting and his ability to subvert expectations, the artist creates sculptural landscapes that challenge viewers to reconsider the narratives shaping our world.

LLCC-Litchfield is hosting a Workforce Programs Showcase and College Now event this evening. LLCC-Jacksonville will be holding a similar event on January 28th that also includes financial aid completion and a community scholarship event. And our Outreach Center in Taylorville will be hosting a workforce and College Now event on February 5th.

Lincoln Lecture on Thursday, February 12th at 9 a.m. in the Trutter Center. The topic this year is "Mr. Lincoln on the Road – Traveling the Original Route 66." The speaker is Timothy Good, who worked for the National Park Service for more than 30 years, including most recently as the superintendent at the Lincoln Home National Historic Site.

Campus Visit Day on Monday, February 16th from 1-4:30 p.m. Prospective students and guests can take tours, visit faculty and staff to learn about programs and services, hear from a student panel, and attend breakout sessions.

Bistro Verde will re-open for the semester on January 27th with To Go service. It will be open Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays, 11 a.m. to 1 p.m., through February 26th. And then from March 25th-April 30th, it will offer the full-service, dine-in restaurant experience.
